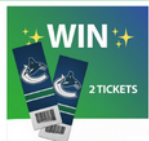

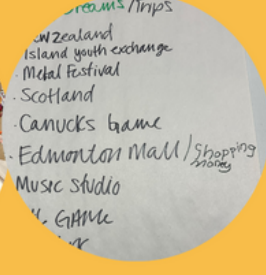
THURSDAY INDOOR PROGRAM
