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PIB “COMMUNITY SAFETY NOTICE” (August 2026)

The Penticton Band Council are becoming increasingly frustrated and concerned of reports received on activities and incidents that are considered very serious and a complete threat to the safety and well being of our community and our members.

Of particular concern is the number of reports or calls our PIB Fire Department, First Nations Police (FNP) or the RCMP attend which are becoming more common are related to non-band member guests invited into and living in our community by PIB members and CP Landowners. The PIB band members and their non-band member guests and businesses who ignore and choose to violate Penticton Indian Band Bylaws obviously have shown no respect and a complete disregard to the safety and well being of our community and our members. This type of behavior and disrespect especially during the extreme dry fire season will no longer be tolerated by this Council:

Should you decide to engage in or carry out any activity that is considered illegal or causes any safety threat or concern which are in contravention of the following Penticton Indian Band Bylaws:

- 1. Penticton Indian Band Trespass Bylaw No.2023-02**
- 2. Penticton Indian Band Community Safety Bylaw No. 2023-03**
- 3. Penticton Indian Band Fire Protection Bylaw No. 2015-01**

Any “non-band member” who chooses to disregard our Band Council authority or Band Bylaws will be investigated and if proven to be in contravention, will be asked to leave our community immediately.

The Penticton Band Council will prepare a Band Council Resolution and instruct our PIB First Nations RCMP to serve and enforce to any individual or business who is in contravention.

“The Penticton Indian Reserve lands are not your personal play areas”.

Our community safety and well being is and remains our priority.
